The spelling lists support key vocabulary to be used in cross-curricular work based on The Arctic.

<p><b>Test Week 2</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Arctic</b> <b>North Pole</b> <b>ice</b> <b>icy</b> <b>snow</b></p> <p>Note the capital letters at the beginning of <i>Arctic</i> and <i>North Pole</i> because these are names of places. Your spelling will be correct if you include the capital letters.</p> <p>Note the <b>soft c</b> sound in <i>ice</i> and <i>icy</i> because the <b>c</b> is followed by <b>e</b> or <b>y</b></p>
<p><b>Test Week 3</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Northern Lights</b> <b>iceberg</b> <b>ice floe</b> <b>mountain</b> <b>blizzard</b></p> <p>These spellings are nouns. They are physical features found in the Arctic. Note the capital letters for <i>Northern Lights</i> because it is the name given to the lights that appear in the sky. Look out for digraphs and trigraphs in each word. This will help you with your spelling and reading of the words.</p>
<p><b>Test Week 4</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Inuit</b> <b>igloo</b> <b>dogsled</b> <b>snowmobile</b> <b>house</b></p> <p>This week we will be learning about the <i>Inuit</i> people who live in the Arctic. Note the capital letter at the beginning of their name.</p>
<p><b>Test Week 5</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>habitat</b> <b>environment</b> <b>predator</b> <b>prey</b> <b>adapted</b></p> <p>This week we will be learning and writing about how Arctic animals have adapted to their environment. These words are some of the scientific vocabulary that we would like you to use.</p>
