Test in Week 1	<p><u>- l (or ul) sound spelt -le at the end of words</u></p> <p>The -le spelling is the most common spelling for the l (or -ul) sound at the end of words, especially in two-syllable words. -le comes after a letter with an ascender (b, d) or descender (y, g) or after double letters or a hard c or hard g</p> <p style="text-align: center;">table little middle angle bottle</p> <p>When you feel confident about using this rule accurately and consistently, try writing sentences that include these words.</p> <p>It is important to understand the spelling rule, so if you want to, see if you can think of or find other words that follow this rule. Test in Week 2	<p><u>The -l sound spelt -al at the end of words</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;">metal pedal capital hospital animal</p> <p>When you feel confident about using this rule accurately and consistently, try writing sentences that include these words.</p> <p>It is important to understand the spelling rule, so if you want to, see if you can think of or find other words that follow this rule. Test in Week 3	<p><u>The or sound is usually spelt a before -l or -ll</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;">ball small</p>
